2025 Museum Studies Symposium Planning Committee

Terms of Reference

The 2025 Symposium Planning Committee is responsible for the planning and support of the Canadian Museum Association's 2025 Museum Studies Symposium, to be held in Victoria, BC the week of Feb 17-21, 2025.

Committee Meetings and Expectations

Meeting Schedule: The committee will meet virtually on a bi-weekly basis from September 2024 to February 2025 with more frequent meetings from September-December during the program development process. Meetings will be 2 hours in duration.

Availability: Committee members will spend approximately 6-8 hours/month participating in the working groups and symposium committee. Members must be available during the week of February 17th, 2025, to travel and attend the symposium, and must commit to attend at least 70% of meetings.

Operating Language: English.

Responsibilities

The Symposium Planning Committee shall:

Review these Terms of Reference.

Evaluate the 2025 CMA Museum Studies Symposium, including:

- Symposium Theme
- Program Schedule
- Member feedback and survey results
- Participate in a sub-committee for program selection relevant to their expertise.
- Develop a two-day symposium program over six months that addresses chosen themes and streams, incorporating member feedback and current developments.
- Integrate perspectives from other organizations (e.g., Provincial and Territorial Museums Associations, the Department of Canadian Heritage, CMA Reconciliation Council).
- Ensure an interactive and collaborative symposium experience.
- Actively participate and facilitate sessions during the symposium.

Sub-Committees

The Symposium Sub-Committees shall:

• Utilize their expertise to curate a dynamic and interactive program relevant to specific themes and streams.

- Meet separately to review session proposals and select presenters, including the development of daily programming.
- Suggest additional content and sessions as needed.
- Involve additional expertise and sub-committee members as necessary.
- Report to the Symposium Committee at regular meetings.

Committee Administration

- Meetings: Held virtually via Microsoft Teams.
- Working Files: Shared via a dedicated SharePoint site.
- Administrative Support: Provided by the CMA, including scheduling and agenda development.

Composition

The Committee will be comprised of:

- One (1) representative from the current CMA Board of Directors.
- One (1) PTMA representative.
- Three to four (3-4) members-at-large from the current CMA Membership (must be members in good standing).
- Two (2) CMA staff members: one as Chair.
- The CMA President and Executive Director as ex-officio members.
- Other CMA staff as needed.

Diversity and Inclusion

Participants will be selected to reflect the diversity of museum experiences, including:

- Indigenous, Black, People of Colour, 2SLGBTQ+, and other equity-deserving professionals.
- Francophone museum professionals.
- Emerging museum professionals.
- Representatives from museums of diverse operational sizes.
- Representatives from various geographic regions of Canada.
- Experts in the identified symposium themes and streams.

Remuneration

Members' service on the committee is ordinarily without remuneration.

Members' travel, registration, and attendance at the 2025 Symposium in Victoria, BC (including accommodation and travel per diems) are typically covered by their employer but may be funded by the CMA with approval.

Members presenting or moderating sessions may be eligible for honoraria, within CMA's budget limits.
